Five Steps to Begin Workers' Compensation eBilling

The first five steps you should take in order to begin workers' compensation eBilling:

- 1. Assess your current billing workflow and identify your high-volume workers' compensation payers.
- 2. Contact your high-volume payers and find out about their eBilling capability, possible clearinghouse requirements, and other key technical information (state-specific requirements).
- 3. Contact your current technology vendors to find out what they can offer you in the way of help and connectivity for all your key payers.
- 4. Determine what will work best for you and your practice management systems, your connectivity options (direct, clearinghouse, etc.), attachment solutions, and start-up/maintenance costs. (See 'Work Comp eBilling Technical Checklist')
- 5. Begin implementation with your payers. Testing is a key component to ensure that all your eBilling processes will work for all your key payers.
